Tips for encouraging & protecting native pollinators

- Wait until 3 consecutive days of 50 degrees before cleaning up gardens. This allows insects sheltering in leaf litter etc. to wake up & survive
- Plant native plants. Check with your nursery to make sure they are native. This is important because native pollinators cannot recognize or eat pollen and nectar from non-native plants.

- Use No insecticides/pesticides
- Refrain from over-mowing. Set mower blades high so as to allow low growing flowers such as violets to bloom in your lawn. Wait till late spring to start mowing, to protect habitat. OR, let some or all of your lawn grow into a meadow & mow pathways.
